The successful candidate will be expected to represent his or her field of expertise and to contribute to the Käte Hamburger Kolleg *Dynamics in the History of Religions between Asia and Europe*, as well as to the overarching CERES-research programme on *Relational Religion*. The position includes mandatory teaching (9 *SWS*) as part of the degree programmes for undergraduate and graduate students.

Positive evaluation as a junior professor or equivalent academic achievement (e.g. habilitation) and evidence of special aptitude are just as much required as the willingness to participate in the self-governing bodies of the RUB and to generally get involved in university processes according to RUB's mission statement. Further requirements are

- high performance in and commitment to teaching
- readiness to participate in interdisciplinary academic work
- willingness and ability to attract external funding
