



ABŪ YA'QŪB JORJĀNĪ

ABŪ YA'QŪB JORJĀNĪ, disciple of Ebn Karrām (d. 255/869). He called God's hands, His face (*wajh*), etc. "bodies" (*aṣām*) and seems, by that, to bear some responsibility for the "anthropomorphic" image of the [Karrāmīya](#). He was also a traditionist (*moḥaddet*); some of his traditions are preserved in the Karrāmī manuscript B.M. 8049.
