



ABŪ SAHL ҶOJANDĪ

ABŪ SAHL ҶOJANDĪ, vizier of the Ghaznavids in the 5th/11th century. He served Sultan Ebrāhīm b. Mas‘ūd (451-92/1059-99) as that ruler’s second vizier, succeeding [Abū Bakr b. Abī Šāleḥ](#), probably in the early part of the reign. All that is known of his background is that he had been secretary in the Ghaznavid *dīvāns* since the time of Sultan Mas‘ūd. At some unspecified date he fell from favor and was arrested and blinded at the sultan’s orders.
