ĀHĪ JOĠATĀ'Ī, SOLṬĀN-QOLĪ BEG TORŠĪZĪ, Chaghatay amir, poet, and companion of Ġarīb Mīrzā, a son of the Timurid sultan, Ḥosayn Bāyqarā. His *taḵalloṣ* prior to Āhī was Nargesī. He wrote in both Persian and Turkish; according to 'Alī-Šīr Navā'ī, he wrote a *Ḳamsa* in imitation of Neẓāmī's, but it failed to become popular. Āhī died in Tabrīz in 927/1521.
