



‘ALĪ B. AḤMAD BALĪ

‘ALĪ B. AḤMAD BALĪ, ABU’L-QĀSEM NŪR-AL-DĪN, post-3rd/9th century astronomer. Like his more famous fellow townsman, he was known as Abū Ma’sar (Brockelmann, 1938, 298). He wrote a *Ketāb al-madkal fī ‘elm al-aḥkām al-falakīya* (“Book of the introduction to the science of astrological judgments”) in seventy-three chapters (Krause, 1936, 450), and a *Ketāb al-madkal fī ‘elm al-nojūm* (“Book of the introduction to the science of the stars”) in sixty chapters (Krause, 1936, 514); there is said to be a Persian translation of the latter. He also composed a *Ketāb al-ṭamad fī bayān anna al-samāwāt be ḡayr ‘amad* (“Book of the dregs [?] in explanation of the fact that the heavens are without supports”).
