



AMĪN LAŠKAR

AMĪN(-E) LAŠKAR (Trustee of the Army), Qajar title held by Mīrzā ‘Enāyatallāh and Mīrzā Qahramān (see below) under Nāṣer-al-dīn Shah.

In 1271/1854-55, [Mīrzā Āqā Khan Nūrī](#), the prime minister, reluctantly put Mīrzā ‘Enāyatallāh, the then *amīn-e laškar*, in charge of the Wezārat-e Laškar (Ministry of the Army), only to replace him a year later by his own fifteen-year-old son, Dāvūd Khan. He seems, however, to have held the office of *amīn-e laškar* until the dismissal of Mīrzā Āqā Khan in Moḥarram, 1275/August, 1858, when he was again entrusted with the administration of Wezārat-e Laškar, but this time under Moḥammad Khan Sepahsālār. Mīrzā ‘Enāyatallāh died in 1277/186-61.
