



AṄGULIMĀLIYA-SŪTRA

AṄGULIMĀLIYA-SŪTRA, a Buddhist text concerning the conversion to Buddhism of a robber called Aṅgulimāla. The work is known from Pali (Aṅgulimāla Sutta) and from translations into Chinese and Tibetan. A passage from the Aṅgulimāliya-sūtra is quoted in a text whose Sogdian version has been published. A smaller, still unlocated passage from the same work is found in Khotanese.
