



## BADĪ' BALĶĪ

**BADĪ' BALĶĪ**, ABŪ MOḤAMMAD BADĪ' B. MOḤAMMAD B. MAḤMŪD BALĶĪ, poet of the 4th/10th century, contemporary and panegyrist of Abū Yaḥyā Ṭāher b. Fażl b. Moḥammad Čaġānī (d. 381/991), one of the rulers of the Čaġānīān district in Transoxiana. Some verses by him are quoted in the *Lobāb al-albāb* of 'Awfī (Tehran, pp. 260-61), who also gives the name and lineage of his patron. Hedāyat (*Majma' al-foṣaḥā'* I, pp. 456-62) attributed Badī's verses to Badāye'ī BalĶī (q.v.), the poet of the 5th/11th century who wrote the didactic poem *Pand-nāma-ye Nōšīravān* or *Rāḥat al-ensān*; in fact he had mistaken the former's name for the latter's pen-name and mixed up their writings.
