FĪRŪZKŪH, name of two towns: (1) a fortified city in the medieval Islamic province of **Ġūr** in Central Afghanistan, which was the capital of the senior branch of the Ghurid sultans (see **GHURIDS**) for some sixty years in the later 6th/12th and 7th/13th centuries; (2) fortress and surrounding settlement in the Damāvand region of the Alborz mountains in northern Persia.
